Fundraising projects

We offer scholarships to students who have the qualifications and skills to study at our school and enrich our community but lack the financial means. These students come from all over the world, although we have identified several specific groups for which we actively raise funds. We believe that education represents a significant step forward for these students and we are confident that after completing their studies, they will contribute to building a better future for their home countries. With this in mind, over the past year, we have focused our fundraising efforts on young women in the Middle East and North Africa, students from conflict zones and refugees from around the world.

Highlights / Events

2023 - 2024

Our primary highlight of this past year is, of course, the numerous scholarships we awarded to students. But that's not all!

- » We now have 1.659 UWC Maastricht alumni. These are all students who finished their final year of high school at our school. The total number of students who have studied here is even higher!
- » Our first IB Career-related Programme students graduated this year. This programme, designed to align with career aspirations, started two years ago, and the first pioneers have just received their diplomas! We offer various courses, such as Business and Sustainability, Fashion and Music.
- » From Maastricht to Amsterdam, we organized many events celebrating our impact and connecting with our sponsors. We look forward to welcoming you again in the new school year!
- We hosted the first Sustainability Conference for Dutch International Schools!
 9 schools joined us for a day filled with insightful discussions, hands-on workshops and inspiring presentations about how to create a more sustainable future for all.
- » 7 women have joined our Female Empowerment Project, bringing the total number of members to 56! We are thrilled to see so many people making quality education available for girls from the MENA region and beyond. These students possess the skills and qualifications to thrive at our school, but financial barriers would have prevented them from seizing this opportunity.

Our Impact

LOCAL IMPACT

As a school with a strong commitment to social responsibility, we aim to play an active role in society and teach our students the importance of their actions. Consequently, all our students regularly engage in community service. Every year, they dedicate a total of 40.000 hours to projects in Maastricht and the surrounding region. These range from working in elderly homes and being buddies to children with mental disabilities to picking up litter and collecting donations for the food bank.

During her two years at UWC Maastricht, **Bella** passionately volunteered at Vorkje Prikken, an organization that serves meals to those seeking companionship or lacking the financial means to cook for themselves. Bella's role was dynamic, involving cooking, cleaning and serving, but her favorite part was connecting with the clients. She enjoyed sharing Brazilian dishes from her home country, which have now become popular staples at the restaurant. In return, she mastered the art of making 'Limburgse rijstevlaai,' a treat she now prepares for her family. Language barriers were hardly an obstacle for Bella, as she made use of the opportunity to pick up some Dutch and taught Portuguese to the staff.

Her time at Vorkje Prikken was truly fulfilling, offering Bella invaluable lessons and the joy of making a difference.

GLOBAL IMPACT

In addition to working on projects in the Maastricht region, we encourage our students to identify and address challenges in their home countries. Each year, many of our students, sometimes even before they graduate, work on projects during breaks or remotely while studying at our school. They apply the knowledge and skills they have gained at UWC Maastricht to make a positive impact both locally and globally.

For instance, we have (current and former) students working to improve living conditions in refugee camps in Western Sahara, address the lack of education for orphans in Laos or combat discrimination against LGBTQ+ communities globally.





To bridge the digital divide, **Nissan** organized workshops for youngsters at the Basudev orphanage in Hathazari, Chittagong, Bangladesh. These sessions focused on digital literacy, a critical skill in today's tech-driven world, and included personality development to boost confidence and interpersonal skills.

A key part of the project was establishing a small pc lab in the orphanage, equipped with four desktop computers. These provide ongoing access to digital resources, ensuring that the benefits of the workshops extend beyond the initial sessions and fostering a culture of continuous learning and innovation.

From a young age, **Aoife** had a deep appreciation for nature. Her mother cooked with seasonal vegetables and their household was very attuned to environmental issues. Aoife's commitment to creating a better and more sustainable world only grew stronger. At UWC Maastricht, she joined students from various nationalities and cultures and they worked around tackling climate change from diverse perspectives.

In 2014, with the Paris Agreement dominating the media, Aoife recognized climate change as a significant threat to the future. But while she worried about the future for her grandchildren, her classmates from other countries were already facing the harsh realities of climate change, such as extreme droughts and failed harvests. This reinforced Aoife's decision to take action!

Determined to continue her fight after graduating from UWC Maastricht, Aoife became a UN Youth Representative, advocating for climate change to be prioritized by the United Nations. During this time, she also co-founded "World's Youth for Climate Justice", a movement that combats the climate crisis through international law and champions climate justice, together with her close friend and fellow UWC Maastricht student Jule. With two hundred young activists, they aim to make a global impact. Their efforts, ranging from advocacy to research for a fairer climate, are rooted in international law. They have even initiated a case at the International Court of *Justice concerning climate justice.*

Currently, Aoife lives in the Hague and works for the Coalition of Finance Ministers for Climate Action, continuing her mission to make a difference.

We are excited to announce the launch of the UWC Endowment Fund this school year, ensuring a long-term structure that allows young changemakers from around the world to study at one of our schools.
